As pediatric oncology nurses, we work with many patients who will eventually lose their life, even with improving cure rates. Historically, nursing curriculums have been woefully inadequate at providing education related to caring for dying children.

The VCU Medical Center's Children's Hospital is presenting a two-day workshop discussing end-of-life care issues relating to pediatric patients.
