I. Call to order

In accordance with Section 2.2-3708.2(A)(3) of the Virginia Freedom of Information Act (the "Act"), this meeting of the VCU Health System Board of Directors was held through electronic means via a conference telephone line to discuss health care and operational matters related to the emergency declared by Governor Northam on March 12, 2020. Dr. Rao called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m. He began with a Report of the President and Chair. He noted the both the University and Health System are facing changes due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He stated he was proud of how everyone has risen to act as ONE

VCU. He continued, that the most vulnerable patients are still being seen especially through Massey Cancer Center, Pauley Heart Center, and he reported the University is still educating. He stated VCU is rising to the challenges by adapting, persevering, becoming more flexible. Dr. Rao expressed gratitude to the University designated staff that continue to work especially the police, environmental services, and health care team members, who continue to show courage and selflessness during the pandemic. He continued, that he has been inspired by the many stories of creative problem solving, innovation, and support for each other that have come out of the current crisis, all of which will serve VCU and Virginia well into the future. He then reported the accomplishments that have occurred in a short amount of time. Dr. Rao touched on the surge capacity plans that include the use of the Honors dormitory on the VCU campus. He spoke about the development and use of the rapid COVID-19 testing, which has increased the number of tests done in a day, as well reducing the time waiting for the test results. Dr. Rao reported there are 17 new clinical trials related to COVID-19, 1000 plus telehealth visits a day, and highlighted the new N95 mask sterilization process. He also explained the "Thumbs Up" campaign, which helps to ensure health care team members come to work healthy and prepared for work. Next, Dr. Rao spoke about two significant philanthropic funds. He stated an anonymous donor gave a \$1M challenge gift that will be used to support health care staff and patients, and noted a student fund was established to help students that need support while away from VCU. He then mentioned about the University's hiring freeze. He said financial advocacy is top of mind and reported he recently met with Senators Kain and Warner regarding the higher education funding shortfall. Then, he spoke about emergency changes to Medicare and

Medicaid programs. He reported Medicare will pay fee for service as a percentage of 2019 claims and Medicaid sequestration and DSH payment cuts will be delayed. Lastly, Dr. Rao expressed his sincere gratitude to the leadership at VCU and VCU Health System, the health care workers, students, and faculty for stepping up during the COVID 19 pandemic.

II. Motion Into Closed Session
