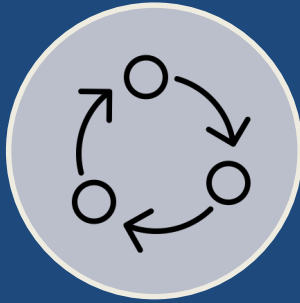

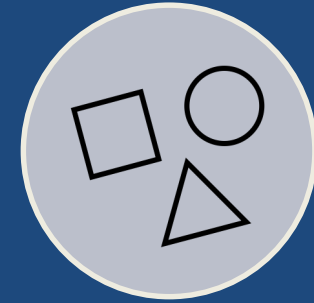

Outbreaks in LTC Facilities over 13 Weeks

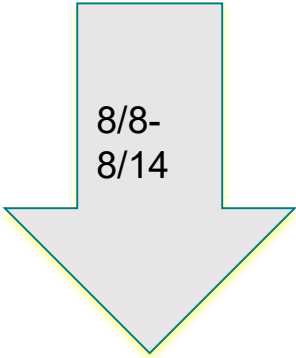
Number of Outbreaks by Facility Type and Date VDH Notified

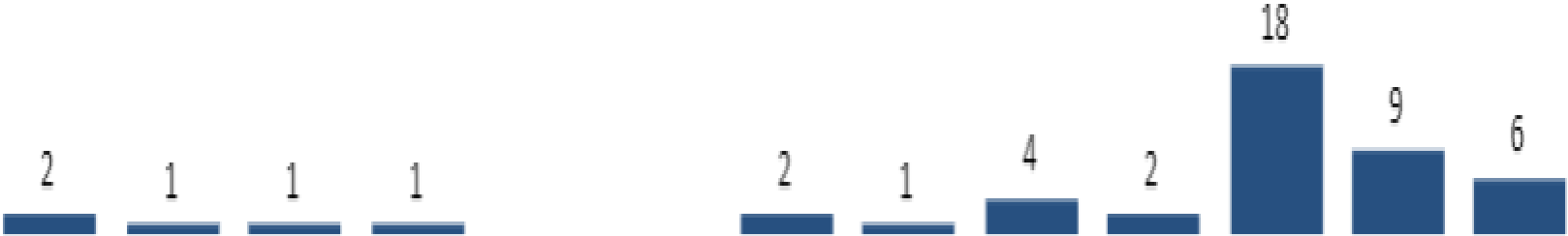

Number of Outbreaks by Facility Type and Date VDH Notified

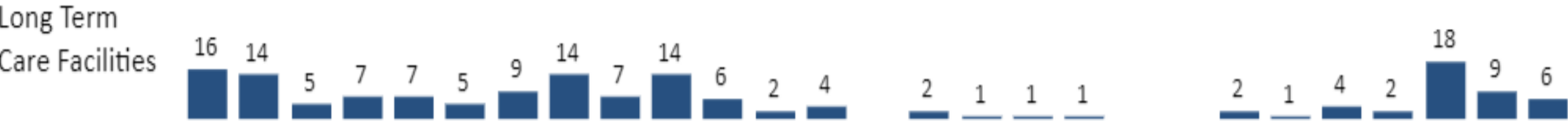

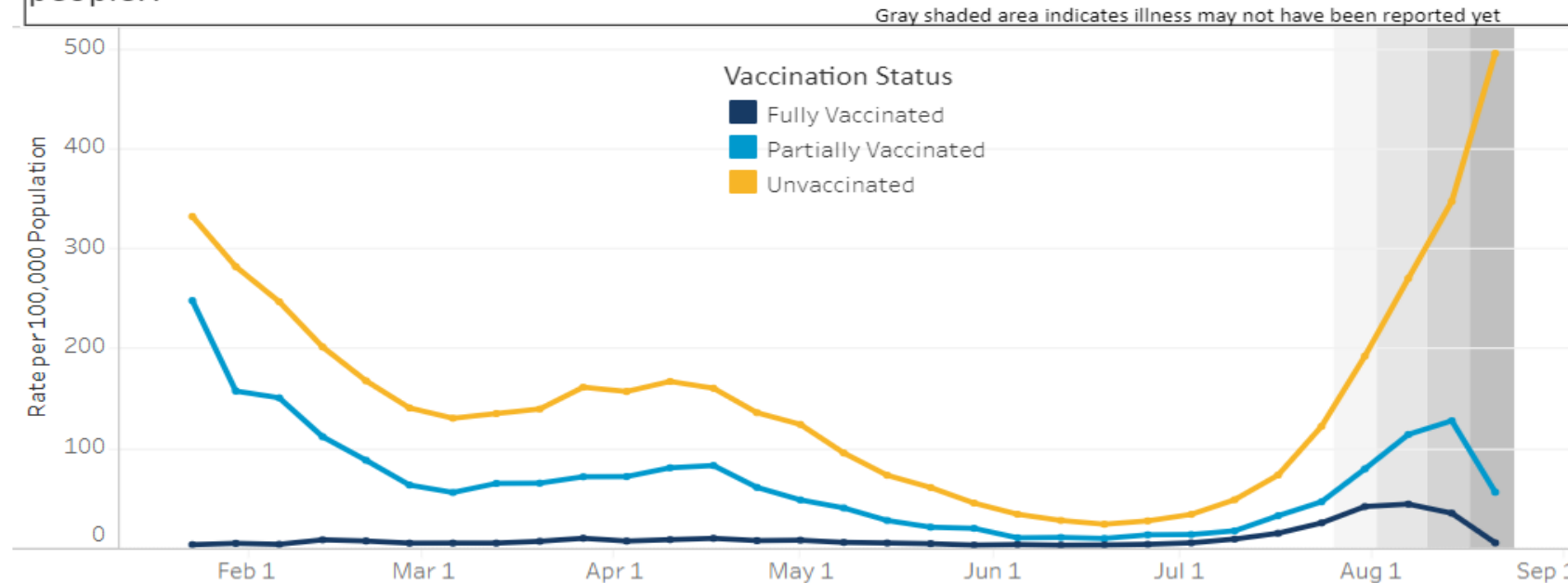

Breakthrough Cases Virginia Data

Between 1/17/2021 and 8/21/2021, unvaccinated people developed COVID-19 at a rate **13.3 times higher** than fully vaccinated people and **2.6 times higher** than partially vaccinated people.†



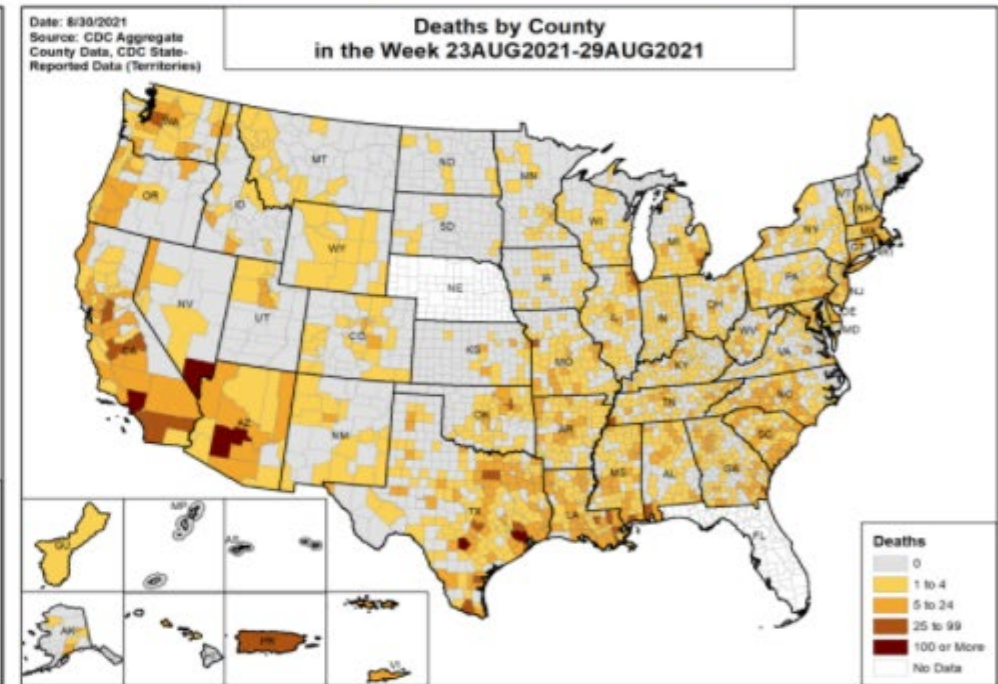
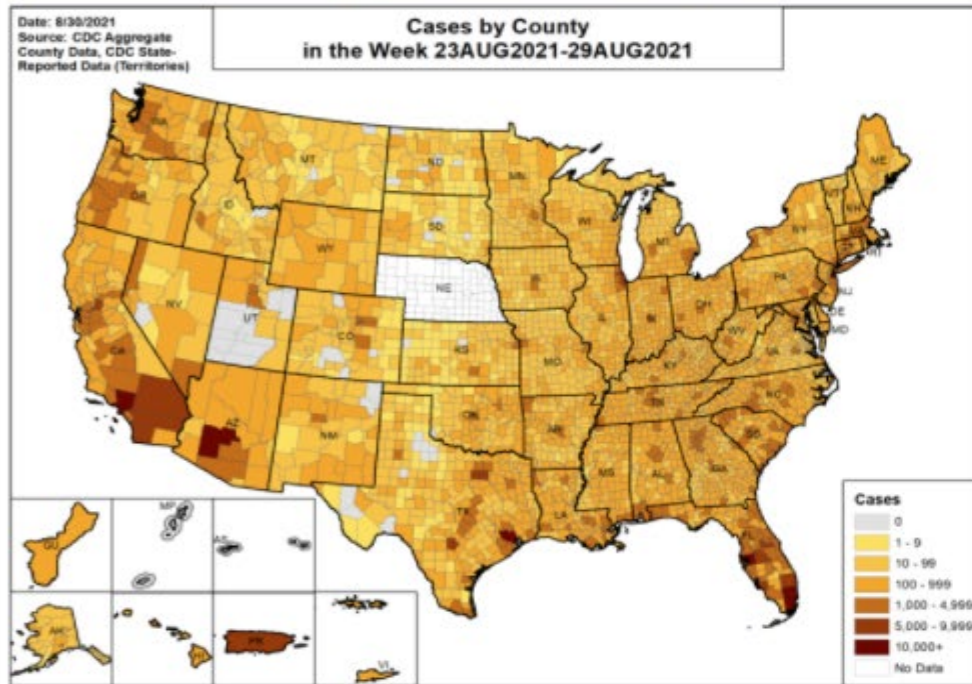
Vaccine Breakthrough Cases

As of 8/21/2021, 4,767,990 Virginians have been fully vaccinated against COVID-19. Of these people, **0.2%** have developed COVID-19, **0.009%** have been hospitalized, and **0.0017%** have died.

Percent Change from Previous 7 Days: -10.5%

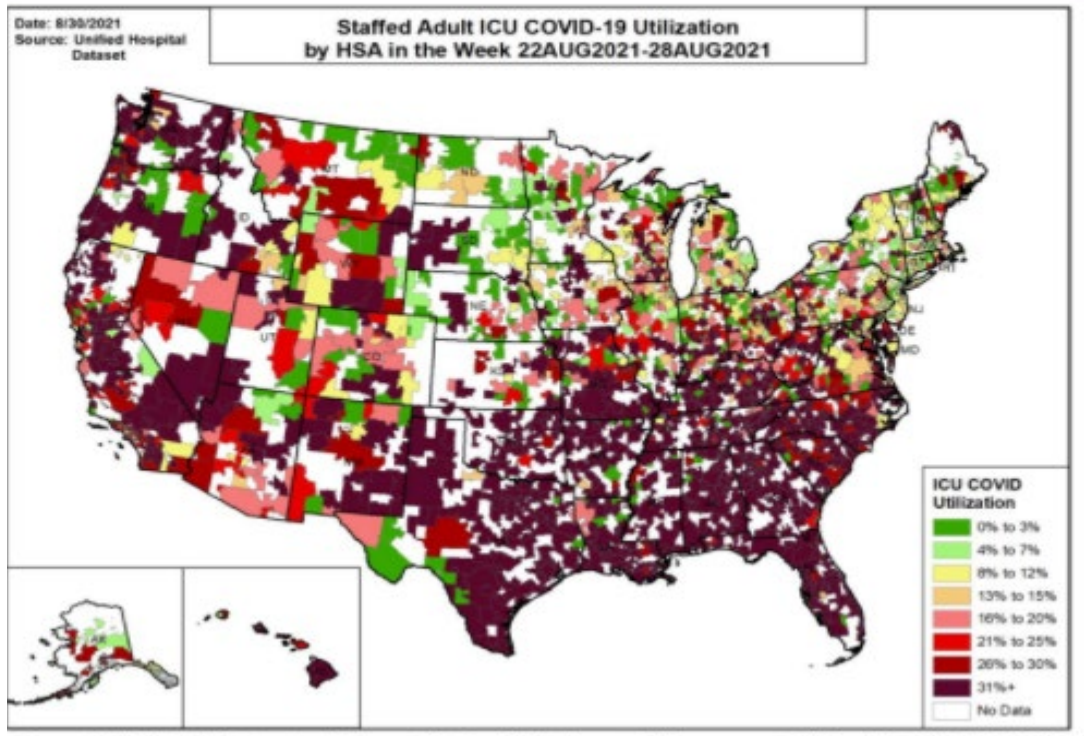
Total Cumulative Deaths: 636,015

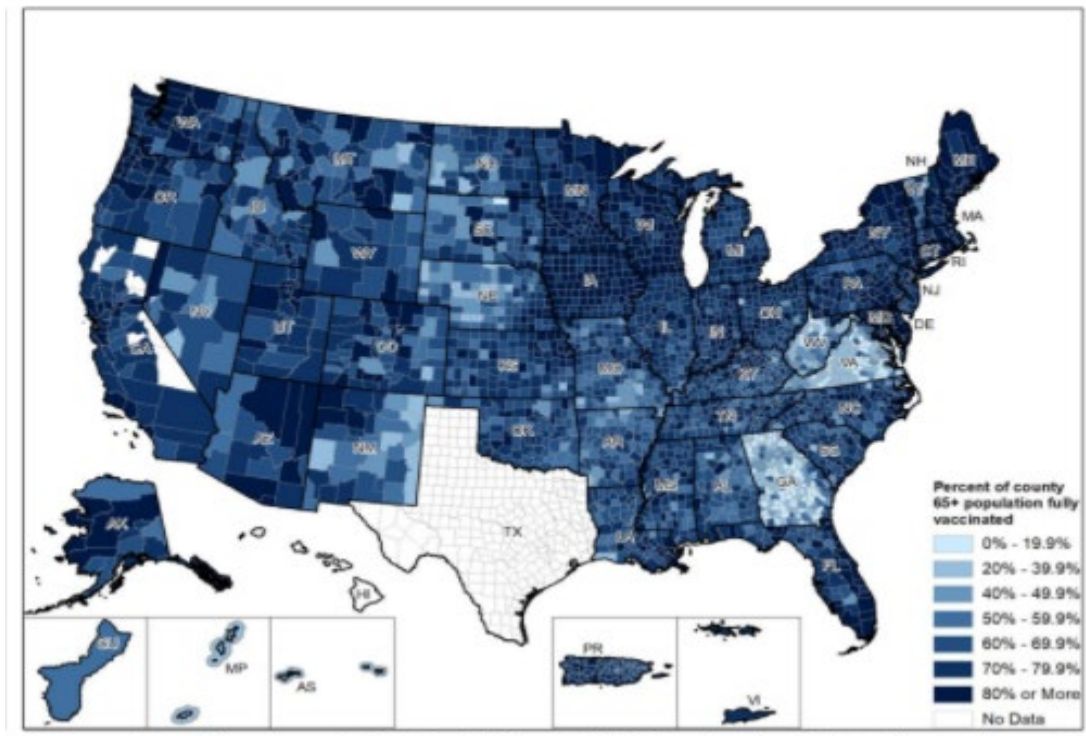
ICU Beds with COVID-19 Patients

VDH COVID Updates

In preparation for LTCF boosters and 3rd dose COVID-19 vaccine support once ACIP and CDC guidelines are released, VDH is requesting that the following survey and background information is widely distributed:

In the news: Ivermectin “Don’t Do it” Toxic, no evidence for efficacy

A Fauci MD

Manufacturer (Merck) statement on Imervectin for COVID-19

- No scientific basis for a potential therapeutic effect against COVID-19 from pre-clinical studies;
- No meaningful evidence for clinical activity or clinical efficacy in patients with COVID-19 disease,
- A concerning lack of safety data in the majority of studies.

Frequently touted pre-publication release of “Randomized trial” of ivermectin efficacy pulled from journal website-ethical concerns

Plagiarism

Faked data

British Medical Journal/Cochrane Reviews (highly respected, evidence-based publications)

What not to use

Treatments **not** indicated for COVID19

- hydroxychloroquine
- ivermectin
- lopinavir/ritonavir +/- interferon-beta
- darynavir/cobucstat
- oseltamivir
- ribavirin
- hydroxychloroquine/azithromycin

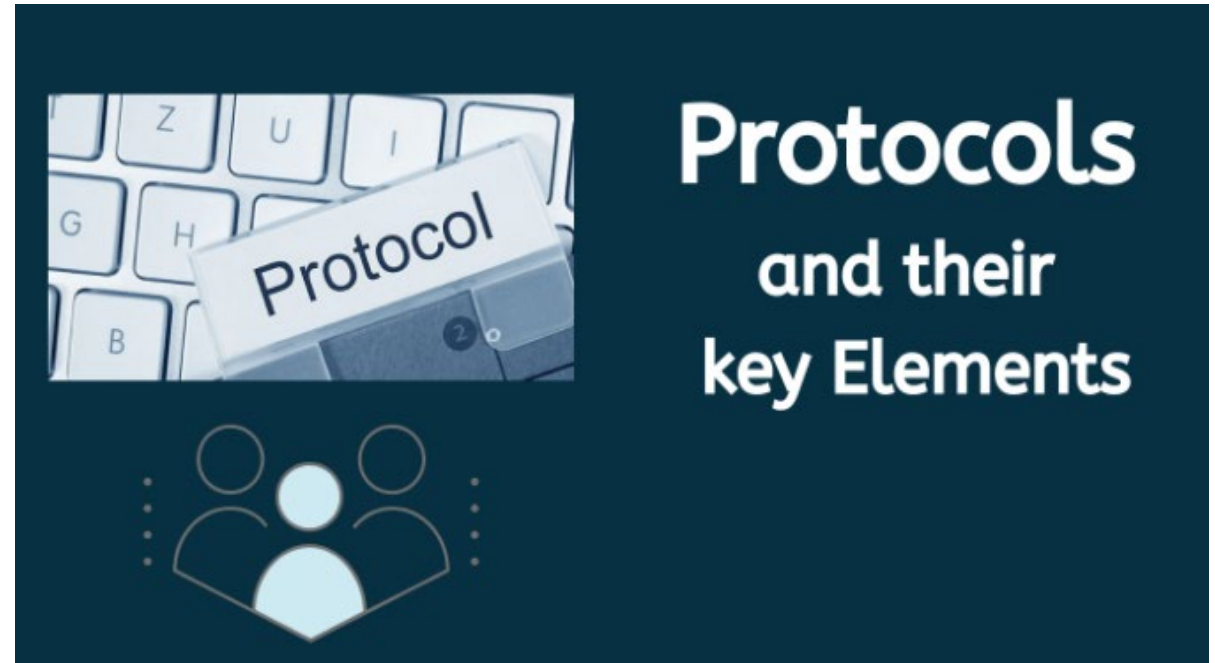

Revisit Monoclonal Antibodies Resources



As Healthcare providers continue to fight the COVID-19 pandemic, effective treatments are needed to reduce transmission rate, hospitalizations, and the overall burden of COVID-19 on the United States health care system. Depending on age, medical history, and length of time symptomatic, monoclonal antibody (mAb) treatment might be a prudent and beneficial course of treatment for COVID-19 patients. The human body's immune system creates antibodies to fight off viruses.
